Through generous donations, we have been able to provide the tools, supplies and training for communities that have needs different than those in the USA or other parts of the world.

Our basic human needs are the same no matter where one lives yet some have greater challenges to get the basics like water, food, let alone feminine hygiene. Some of the communities we work with have faced terrible drought issues again this year. Their food supply has been limited and water sources reduced. For some of us, these difficulties are hard to imagine. They are very real. We have a lot to learn from one another. We should each also realize the power of our own words and actions.

My parents always said be kind, considerate and respectful. It is not only because that is the proper way to engage with others, but is is also how we hope to be treated.

I have had days that could have been better, and then was kindly greeted. It changed my thoughts at that moment which



altered the way I approached the rest of the day. It did not remove the challenges of the day but changed the way I looked at things.

In 2024, we have reached our largest number of communities and invidiuals in one year. By December, we will have worked with 16 communities providing supplies and training. It has been a busy eleven months.

In November, we will visit six communities in Zimbabwe working with a Doctor's Program hosted by Imvelo Safari Lodges. Sewpportive Friends will be provided a tent and we will teach girls and women how to sew the washable, reusable pads while they are waiting to see a physician. We have already purchased and delivered the sewing machines, fabric, scissors, thread, table cloths, needles, etc. to the Imvelo team. Each of the communities will receive the tools to continue sewing.

It is an honor to be invited to participate in such an impactful program. We are grateful for the Imvelo Safari Lodges team for the amazing work they are implementing – humanitarian efforts and wildlife conservation. https://imvelosafarilodges.com/

From Zimbabwe, we will travel to Kenya working with Elevate Her Foundation in Kendu Bay. They have already received their sewing machines and supplies, and the initial training was taught by Irine, Co-Founder of Elevate Her Foundation. We are excited to meet them and provide additional training.

Our friends in Africa are true warriors changing lives. They motivate, inspire and are dedicated in uplifting others.

Thank you to all our contributors, volunteers and sewing team members for your kindness! We each have a purpose and need to continue to work with a gentle, kind heart, expecting nothing in return.

There is not a solution for every issue, but by continuing to give and be kind that provides hope. Hope provides courage which brings change in thought and action.
